#### GOALS:

The fellow will competently perform a detailed neurological examination, which will allow him/her to localize lesions and determine an appropriate diagnostic work-up and treatment plan.

# LEARNING OBJECTIVES REQUIRED TO MEET SPECIFIC ROTATION GOALS:

# Diagnose and treat:

- 1. Headaches-differentiate and recommend appropriate diagnostic tests, recommend treatment.
- 2. Nervous system Neoplasia: brain and spinal cord.
- 3. Common Movement Disorders.
- 4. Seizure Disorders: understands common presentations, work-up and diagnostic testing indicated, medical treatment and indications for referral to a neurologist.
- 5. Common peripheral nerve palsies.
- 6. Vertebral spine disease: disc disease, spinal stenosis.
- 7. Peripheral pressure neuropathy: meralgia paresthetica, peroneal nerve palsy, ulnar, radial, median (carpel tunnel), sciatica.
- 8. Polyneuropathy: alcoholic, diabetic, nutritional, e.g. pernicious anemia.
- 9. Transient Ischemic Attacks: presenting symptoms, diagnostic work-up, imaging studies indicated, medical treatments, indications for surgical intervention.
- 10. Chronic pain conditions.
- 11. Inflammatory and Auto-immune diseases affecting the nervous system: Lupus, Multiple Sclerosis.
- 12. Dementia.
- 13. Other disorders of the nervous system: labrynthitis, Meniere's syndrome, herpes zoster, Bell's palsy, trigeminal neuralgia.
